

Oklahoma Statewide Caregiver Respite Programs

Respite – Planned or emergency care provided to a child or adult with a special need in order to provide temporary relief to the family caregiver.

Caregiver – The unpaid person providing primary or full-time care for a family member or another person living in their home.

Care Receiver – The person receiving primary or full-time care.
