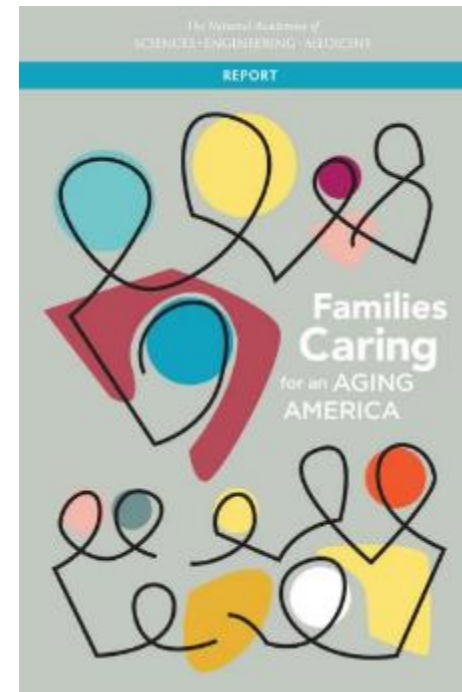


Families Caring for an Aging America (2016)

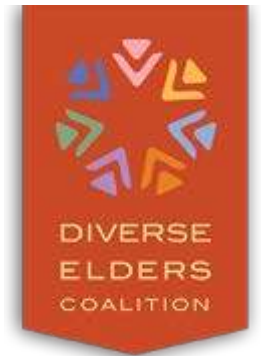
