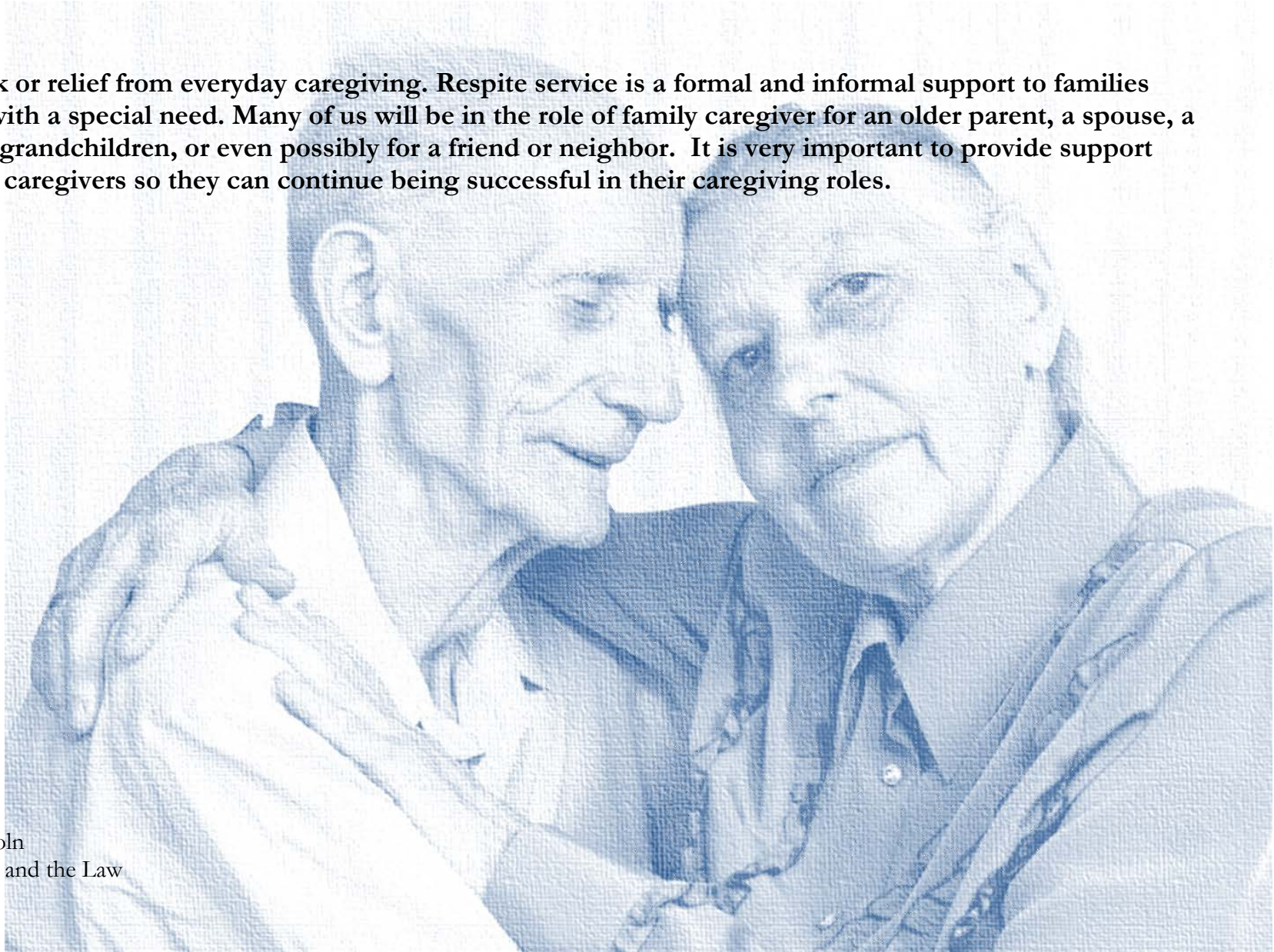


# Program: Lifespan Respite Network Logic Model

## Situation:

Respite is a short break or relief from everyday caregiving. Respite service is a formal and informal support to families that have a loved one with a special need. Many of us will be in the role of family caregiver for an older parent, a spouse, a child with a disability, grandchildren, or even possibly for a friend or neighbor. It is very important to provide support and respite options for caregivers so they can continue being successful in their caregiving roles.
