

LATEST CENSUS DATA ON AGING

THE NATION

- 2020: First time in history that People Over 65 outnumber Children Under Five
- 2040: Seniors are 21.7% of the U.S. population
- Social Security constituted 90% or more of the income received by 35% of beneficiaries in 2013
- Volunteer Caregiving is now represented in nearly 1,000 programs throughout the U.S.

ELDER ORPHANS

- 2015 Census: 42.8 percent of older Americans are aging alone and lacking family or support that would take care of them.
- A majority of elder orphans are women. In the updated 2015 census, the percentage of older people living alone had doubled since the last count.

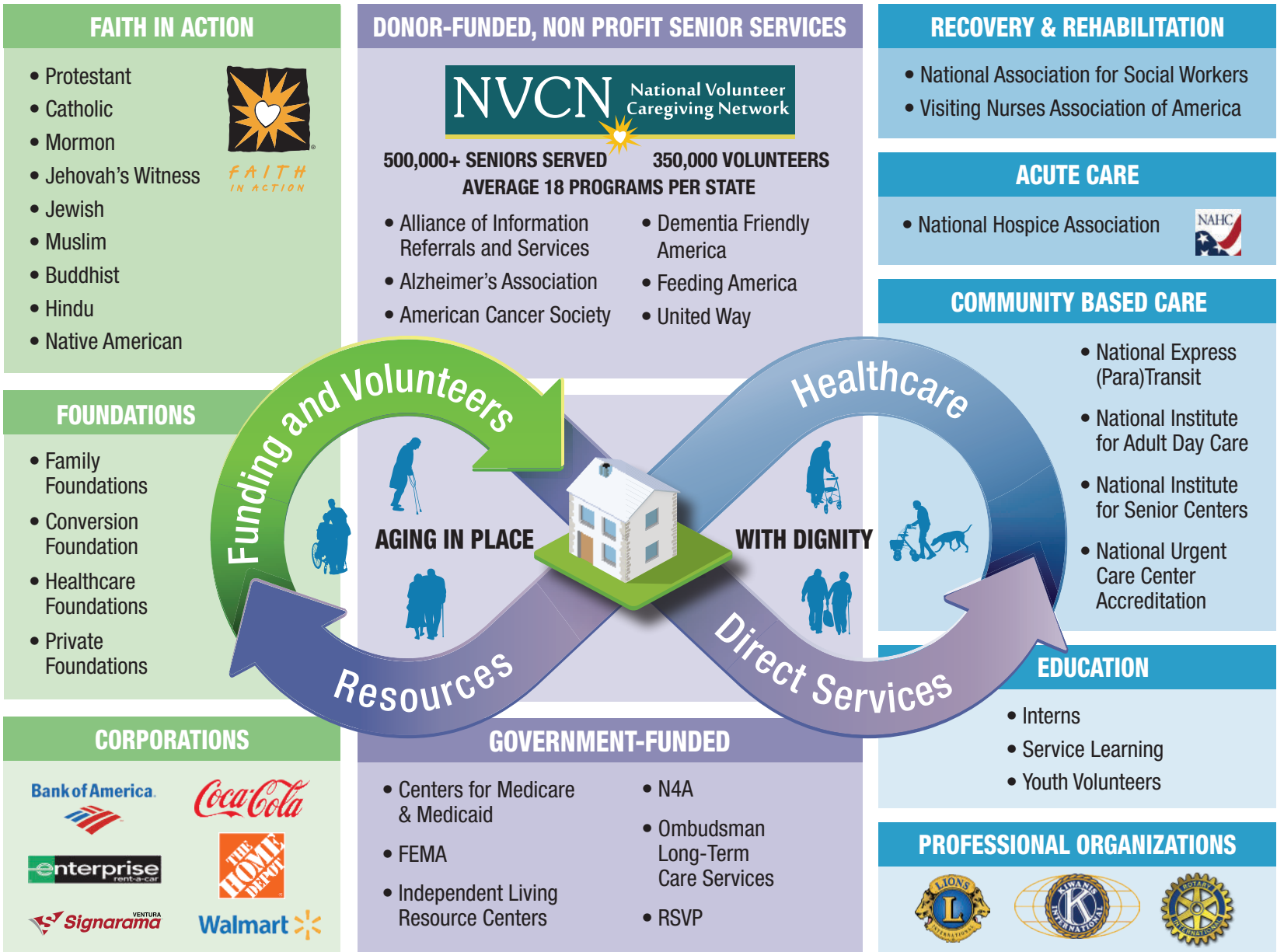
PHILANTHROPY

- Only 1% of total U.S. giving is directed to Aging/Seniors, according to the Foundation Center
- By contrast, 28 percent goes to projects for children and youth.

FAITH-BASED

- The National Congregations Study by Duke University tracks more than 300,000 congregations in the United States
