- ECCHO is a civic engagement training program that seeks to improve community health outcomes by engaging those most impacted by generational and systemic racism in Milwaukee, Dane, and Rock county.
- Cohorts are overseen by a Local Program Coordinator (LPC) who compensates participants for their work and provides them with the training and resources they need to successfully implement their project.



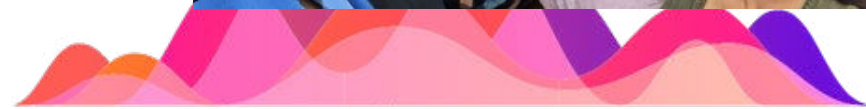
Goals
